The University of Kansas Medical Center (KUMC) is establishing a biorepository of blood and urine samples from adults with Polycystic Kidney Disease (PKD).

## GOALS OF THE PKD REPOSITORY

- To provide specimens to investigators for the discovery of biomarkers that may help to:
  - Monitor PKD progression
  - Determine the effectiveness of new treatments

## WHO IS ELIGIBLE TO PARTICIPATE?

PKD patients between 18 to 70 years of age, who have had an MRI or CT scan of the kidneys within the last 5 years

## WHAT DOES A STUDY VISIT INVOLVE?

- Fasting blood and urine collection
- Height, weight, and blood pressure measurement
- Health and medical history questionnaire

## HOW MUCH TIME DOES THE STUDY REQUIRE?

Single one hour visit
