The University of Kansas Medical Center (KUMC) is establishing a biorepository of blood and urine samples from adults with Polycystic Kidney Disease (PKD).

GOALS OF THE PKD REPOSITORY

- To provide specimens to investigators for the discovery of biomarkers that may help to:
 - o Monitor PKD progression
 - Determine the effectiveness of new treatments

WHO IS ELIGIBLE TO PARTICIPATE?

PKD patients between 18 to 70 years of age, who have had an MRI or CT scan of the kidneys within the last 5 years

WHAT DOES A STUDY VISIT INVOLVE?

- Fasting blood and urine collection
- Height, weight, and blood pressure measurement
- Health and medical history questionnaire

HOW MUCH TIME DOES THE STUDY REQUIRE?Single one hour visit
