


# Annual report

## Research

Made up of 14 prestigious PKD physicians and scientists, the Scientific Advisory Committee (SAC) oversees our research and medical programs aimed at discovering and delivering treatments for PKD. This esteemed group meets throughout the year to discuss relevant medical issues, provide guidance to our staff and review and approve research applications for grants and fellowships in the field of PKD science.

### RESEARCH FUNDING

Our Research Grant Program funds vital laboratory and clinical studies to increase understanding of the genetic and pathological processes involved in PKD, and to accelerate the development of potential treatments. PKD Foundation Fellowships build momentum in PKD research by recognizing early-career scientists whose achievements identify them as rising stars in the field. Your generous contributions helped us continue to fund eight grant recipients and three research fellows.


### TAKING THE FIGHT TO CAPITOL HILL
